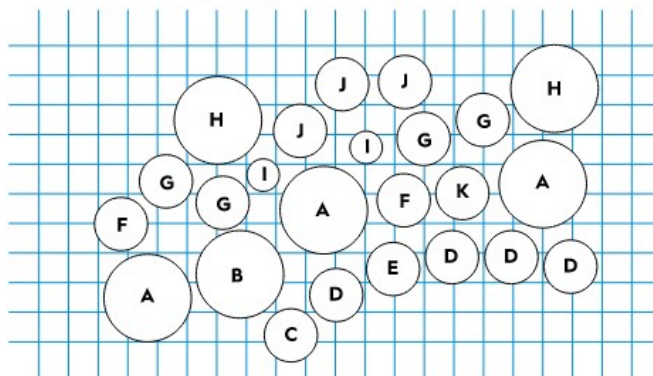

Mary's Tips and Hints

- A. Japanese dwarf Boxwood is a pretty alternative. Better would be "Elijah Blue" Fescue
- C. Artemisia "Silver Mound" - Soft, with delicate, feathery foliage
- I. Foxglove - whatever color you like. Foxglove is perennial. Always a better choice

Choose colors you love in place of those suggested plants as substitutes. There are lots of varieties of each plant.

Be sure the substitutes will be hardy and grow in your planting zone, and share the same attributes

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
